RETURN TO IN-PERSON LEARNING

Due to the end of the Public Health of Emergency in the state of Georgia, Dade County Schools (DCS) will return to normal operation procedures for the 2022 – 2023 school year. However DCS will follow the Public Health Protocols for the 2022 – 2023, and will continue to monitor any outbreaks within our school communities and make necessary adjustments as needed.

Face Coverings

- Optional for students and staff in school buildings, on school transportation, and at extracurricular events

Social Distance

- Social distancing in classrooms and school buildings will be observed if we experience an outbreak within our school community

Visitors & Field Trips

- Volunteers will be permitted to work throughout the school in accordance with DCS volunteer procedures
- Field trips, cocurricular, and extracurricular activities will resume with normal operations

Water Fountains, School Nutrition, & Student Schedules

- Schools will determine operating procedures for class schedules and lunch schedules as needed
- Water bottle filling stations will replace traditional water fountains

Cleaning and Sanitizing

- DCS will continue the implementation of quarterly Ecovasive treatments
- Hand sanitizer will be available throughout the school district facilities
- DCS will continue thoroughly cleaning the school facilities daily

School Nurses

- Students that develop COVID-19 symptoms at school will be evaluated by the school nurse and necessary protocols related to masks, isolation, and parent contacts will be followed

COVID-19 Vaccinations

- DCS will not require COVID-19 vaccinations
